





REFERENCE LETTER

Klinik Yayasan Angsamerah (KYA), an affiliate of Angsamerah foundation, has been one of the project partners of USAID's Scaling-up for Most At-risk Population – Organizational Performance (SUM II), and Delivering Expanded Resources for AIDS Programming (DERAP) since October 15, 2012.

KYA received three cycle of sub-grants from USAID SUM II in the total amount of IDR. 648,974,435.58 or USD. 58,997.67 for the period October 15, 2012 to February 28, 2015 to support HIV and AIDS prevention to care and ARV treatment interventions for key populations in the province of DKI Jakarta and provided technical assistance to SUM's private clinic partners in Papua, Central and West Java, Jakarta, and Riau Islands; and received one cycle of sub-award from DERAP Project in total amount IDR 542,173,333 equivalent to USD 46,339.60 for the period August 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016 for HIV and AIDS prevention to care services and ARV treatment interventions for key populations in DKI Jakarta.

The objective of the sub-grant award is to support KYA in the promotion of positive health seeking behaviors, friendly services for counseling and HIV testing; clinical care and initiation of ARV treatment and adherence support for ARV treatment for PLHIV.

By SUM II and DERAP technical assistance, KYA succeeded in improving performance of project financial management. Financial standard operating procedure is available and applied in operational management which includes administration, procurement, and accounting and reporting.

KYA established a friendly clinic model for the continuum of HIV prevention to care and comprehensive ARV treatment for key populations in DKI Jakarta. During the two sub-award periods, KYA succeeded contributed significantly to the DKI Jakarta Province's program to increase the number of the key populations receiving HIV testing, clinical services, and ARV treatment. During DERAP (August 1, 2015 - March 2016), KYA served 826 people with HIV counseling and test and received result which was 92% of projected people tested in Angsamerah Clinic. As of March 31, 2016, 187 PLHIV were on ARV treatment which was 155% to the projected PLHIV who those on ARV treatment in Angsamerah Clinic.

KYA satisfactorily achieved all projected indicators in one cycle of sub-grant agreement with SUM II, and one cycle sub-grant agreement with DERAP. The sub-grant agreement with SUM II ended on February 28, 2015, and sub-grant awards with DERAP ended on March 31, 2016. SUM II and DERAP provide KYA in **rating 5**. Rate 1 is poor and rate 5 is the highest performance level.

KYA has maintained proactive communication with SUM II and DERAP. They opened a dialog on a monthly basis to discuss the progress, constraints, and seek recommendations for follow-up actions to address the constraints and strengthen the quality of TA services.

KYA submitted SUM II and DERAP work narratives and financial reports on a monthly basis. The reports described the planned activities, progress, obstacles, recommendation, and a work plan for the upcoming month. I certify that the report is in high quality in term of substance, content, and accountability.
